- High level of self-motivation and willingness to learn and participate
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Experience contributing to long-range organizational planning, including financial sustainability and resource alignment
- A collaborative mindset and willingness to take initiative within a dynamic and growing organization
- Strong time-management skills and the ability to commit the time required to fulfill Board responsibilities
- Previous Board or Committee experience is preferred

Role Details:

- Board terms are two (2) years in length, which may be extended for an additional two (2) terms, up to a maximum of six (6) years in total.
- The Board meets a minimum of six (6) times per year.
- As a Board member, you will also serve as a member of at least one specialized area of interest which, generally, meets on alternate months to the Board meetings.
