In this role, you will:

- Sorting, stickering and packaging snacks for hospital deliveries and home deliveries
- Stickering and labelling meals in the freezers with nutritional and cooking information
- Build boxes and prepare materials for food program packing volunteers
- Help unload incoming supplies and food deliveries
- Conduct inventory checks and help organize freezers as required
- Deliver food items to BC Children's Hospital and/or Surrey Memorial Hospital, as needed
- Maintain food safety best practices

What you bring to the role:

- Available weekly on Tuesdays, from 9:30 am - 12:30 pm
- Reliable transportation and/or have access to your own vehicle
- Valid BC Driver's License
- 19+ years of age
- A clear Vulnerable Sector Criminal Records Check
- Up-to-date immunizations
- Annual influenza vaccination is recommended, or a mask is required in clinical settings
- Dedicated and reliable
- Excellent communication skills
